South Dakota Many Days Heavy snow carry over from December plus considerable snow during month and one of the windlest Januarys of feecord resulted in many days of blowing snow. There were also many days of freezing rain. The heaviest freezing rain occurred on the 22nd and 27th. The above conditions caused numerous days when transportation was at a near standstil due to blocked roads and closed sirports. Many school closings were reported in the area during month and other activities were curfalled. Many times roads were opened with anow plows and soon afterwards blowing snow would close them again. Some of the country roads went long periods without being opened resulting in wardships for the farmers.

Days of blowing snow were reported as follows: Aberdeen-8, 19, 22 23, 24, 26, 27, 31; Huron-8, 12, 19, 20, 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 30, 31; Slour Falle-2, 8, 9, 19, 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 31.
