There were Violent thunderstorps with amounts of rain locally over 2 inches, late on the 29th and early on the 29th, triggered home-damaging mud and rock slides on Camelback Mountain. Numerous homeowners had to remove considerable debris from homes and yards. Dozens of roads and streets whre closed. In the Scottsdale area many cars were either stranded in washes or carried downstream. People were rescued all through the night, but no injuries were reported. There was some flooding of homes and extensive water damage to a school and high school. Lightning str injuries ALASKA 0 0 4 0 about 5PM Wind. Strong easterly winds out of the passes of the Ci blew the roof off of a house in the Chugach footh of the city of Anchdrage. ugach Mountains ills, just east Matanuska Valley 24-25 Yuma County Heavy thunderstorms deluged sections of the county late on the 24th and early on the 25th. There was considerable flooding of streets in the City of Yuna and many low lying sections of highways in the county. A few residences were flooded in the city. There were a number of power outages due to lightning strikes. No injuries were reported. Brisk east to southeast wind in the Natanuska Vailey on the 18th and on the 22nd caused up to 75% shatter of ripe grain stands in the area. Kenai Peninsula and Afterno Flooding, Wind, Unusually heavy rain along with sudden melt of an early snowpack in the mountains of the Kenal Peninsula and eastern Cook Inlet resulted in flash floods on the Resurrection River and Salmon Creek, both near Seward, on the night of the 20th. The Trail River, Snow River, and the Kenal River lat Cdoper Landing were flooding on the morning of the 21st. The Kenal River at Cdoper Landing remained above flood stage until the 25th; the rains tapered off on the afternoon of the 21st. There were numerous mudsides on the Seward Highway - which connects Seward and Anchorage - on the 21st. Evening Heavy thundershowers with intermittent hail rapidly filled the normally day washes, especially the Pantanb Wash and the Rillito River. Flooding occurred on almost 100 streets and roads throughout the city, particularly on the north and east sides where local amounts of rain ranged upward to 3 1/2 inches. Nearly a dozen cars, some with occupants, were swept into washes on the east side. One man was missing and presumed drowned. Two bbys were carried down the Rillito River 1 1/2 miles before they chuld reach ground after their car failed to cross the stream. The size of hail ranged upward to 3/4 inch diameter with some as large as golf halls. Up to 5 inches of hail overed the ground in the Mt. Lemmor area. Only minor damage was reported. Winds of 40 to 50 m.p.h. blew out some windows in residences and businesses. Evening ARIZONA Parker Yuma County Winds gusting to over 50 m.p.h. caused moderate damage to build-ings, residences, alreort hangars and trees. Trees fell onto power lines and caused a power failure. The wind also damaged a portion of the roof of e adjoining super market. Thunderstorms moving through the area produced high winds and golf ball size hail. Several outbuildings sustained roof damage from the winds. In the city, there was some roof and tree damage. A power outage was caused when a canopy-type roof was blown onto a transmiss CALIFORNIA SOUTHERN £1 Mirage Airport 6:45 PM unk unk 0 0 n 9:30-10:80 a. 0 rnado touched down on El Mirage field t sail-plane tied to a 1 1/4 in steel cat Tropical storm Kathleen slashed through extreme western Arizona and southeastern California on its way northward. There was no flash flooding in the Yuma area, as was the case in Mohave County; also Imperial, Riverside and Sah Dlego counties of California. The Yuma area, however, did suffer extensive wind damage with gusts reaching 76 m.p.h. Hany power lines were down and much of the city withput power for several hours. Considerable damage was dome to trees, roofs, mobile homes, signs and windows. One man was killed when a 75 ft. palm tree crashed chto his mobile home. Fallen trees and power line poles thocked many streets. Six small airraft suffered extensive damage and two parked semitrailers were overturned. Produce crops, including citrus and pecans, received heavy damage with large quantities of fruit ripped from the trees by the wind. Airport from 6:19 to 6:30 Ph. Kovenent was west north west. 6 Evening Bletrical storm moved into the Los Angels Busin causing numero companies including TV stations, hospitals and irre stations. Los Anceles Bullhead City Mohave County Ð 0 Tropical storm Kathleen with its tourential rains of 2 to 5 inches brought severe flash flooding to Mohave County. The hardest hit was Bullhead City and surrounding area along the Colorado River. The area was devasthed between the afternoon of the 10th and the morning of the 11th. Eight washes carried wells of water from elevations of 0 over 8000 feet to the east and into the Bullhead City area with an elevation of 675 feet. There was devere damage to streets, highways, residences, businesses, water and gas mains, and culverts. Many cars were swamped in tons of debria, Silver Creek Wash, crossing Highway 95, was cut into a 20 to 40 ft. deep canyon by the raging water. The city was severed from all outside assistance. Estimates of damage to roads and streets was put in excess of 5500,000 and damage th private property at \$2,500,000. The county rejorted damages of \$2.1 million to their Record-breaking rainfall for the State of Delaware was measured by an unofficial observer at his home located three miles west of Fenvick Island on Delaware Highway 54. He had been taking rainfall measurements since the 1960's. His rain-gauge was a tube, 11/16 by 5 1/2 inches, mounted on a board fence.
