Office of Naval Research. The Storm Data and Unusual Weather Phenomena narratives, and summaries of Hurricanes/Tropical Storms are prepared by the National Weather Service. The National Climatic Data Center compiles statistics on deaths, injuries, damage and prepares the annual summaries of tornadoes and Lightning. This publication contains our best information on storms, but due to the difficulties inherent in collection of this type of data it is not all-inclusive. Late reports and corrections will be carried quarterly. Maps of zones used in the Storm Data and Unusual Weather Phenomena will be published in all editions.

Storm Data is published monthly by the National Climatic Data Center.




OUTSTANDING STORMS OF THE MONTH







As evidenced by the map below, May and June of 1987 was undoubtedly one of the rainiest periods ever experienced in the South-Central United States. Most of the rainfall shown occurred during a four week period, the last two weeks of May and first two weeks of June, as recurrent thunderstorms plagued the area. Naturally, extensive flooding and flash flooding resulted. Areas hardest hit by flooding included central Oklahoma during the period of May 27th through 31st and portions of northern Texas from June 1st through 15th, but the brunt of the flooding occurred in southern Texas where the only area not to experience a severe flood was lower South Texas (for details see individual state and region reports in the Storm Data and Unusual Weather Phenomena section of both the May and June 1987 issues).






















2. THUNDERSTORM WINDS in NORTH-CENTRAL KANSAS on June 27-28, 1987

During the late evening and early morning of June 27th and 28th, a line of severe thunderstorms formed over the Kansas-Nebraska border and raced southward through north-central Kansas and into the central part of the state within a period of slightly over two hours spread over midnight. The storms' outflow and rapid translation resulted in damaging winds estimated at 70 mph in most places, but which exceeded 100 mph in some locations. Significant damage occurred at Lake Waconda in Mitchell County where 16 people were injured as camping vehicles were tipped and damaged by the 100 mph winds. Nearby Beloit was also hard hit; several structures there failed under the wind load, including a gymnasium.



On the morning of the 28th, an elderly couple, assisted by their daughter, assess the damage to their camper which was tipped over by the 100 mph winds at Lake Waconda. The couple was trapped in the vehicle for an hour and a half before someone came, broke a window, and helped them to escape. 

3. TORNADO at PLAINVILLE, ILLINOIS on June 2, 1987


At 1340CST on June 2nd, a tornado touched down just south of Plainville, Illinois, crossed State Route 96, and passed through a farmstead, narrowly missing the farm house. The short-lived, F1 tornado traversed 1.5 miles in about 3 minutes without causing any major structural damage, but as seen below, the spectacular appearance of the dust-filled vortex was photographed from close range as it churned across a field. The farm house, seen in the top photo, sustained only minor damage.







At 1906EST on the evening of June 12th, a southeastward-moving, strong thunderstorm downburst hit the Highlands area just west of Bowman Field in Louisville, Kentucky with winds of 80 to 90 mph. Huge trees of from 2 to 4 feet in diameter were uprooted in about a 2 square mile area, and some trees were snapped. No structural damage was done by the winds directly, but many homes and vehicles suffered damage from the falling trees. One large tree fell on a moving car, trapping a 14-month-old baby. However, the baby escaped with only minor injuries via the careful efforts of firemen.





5. MICROBURSTS near BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA on June 2, 1987

On the evening of June 2nd, strong thunderstorms in southern Indiana produced high winds across much of the region, including downbursts and microbursts in the vicinity of Bloomington. Below are examples of damage at two locations where winds were determined to have been from microbursts.



During the afternoon and evening of June 13th, thunderstorms that popped up and intensified over east-central Illinois, central and southern Indiana, and a small portion of north-central Kentucky produced a variety of damaging winds over the same areas. Following are featured events — microbursts in southern Indiana and a tornado at Midway, Kentucky — that were associated with these storms.



A sequence of alternating visible and infrared, GOES 6 satellite images shows the birth and development of the storms in Illinois, Indiana, and Kentucky on June 13, 1987. All times shown are EST, although part of the region is in the CST zone. 



7. LIGHTNING during June 1987


As was the case during the previous month, May, lightning again exacted a heavy toll in terms of deaths, injuries and damage during June 1987. Nationwide, there were 18 known deaths and 49 reported injuries attributed to lightning. Following are examples of atmospheric discharges that occurred in Texas and Florida during the month.












The storm packed winds gusting in excess of 50 mph, torrential rains, and outstanding lightning displays as it moved southwestward over Naples and into the Gulf of Mexico. 
On the afternoon of June 30th, a small tornado touched down in a farming area northeast of Denver. Colorado, about 10 miles northnorthwest of the small community of Watkins. Although not an uncommon event, the tornado was observed and monitored by many weather researchers including a PROFS chase team and participants of CINDE. The Fl tornado lasted about 5 minutes as it moved from west to east. A post storm, aerial survey revealed that the tornado gathered crop stubble, mainly wheat, into a herringbone pattern along a 2.2 mile path.



The small condensation funnel of the tornado, and its parent wall cloud.




Location of the June 30th tornado relative to the Denver metro area.




9. HAIL at KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON on June 30, 1987

On the evening of June 30th, Klamath Falls, Oregon was visited by an unusual thunderstorm in that it dropped golfball size and larger hail over west and north sections of the city. Left in the storm's wake were many broken windows, damaged roofs, and dented vehicles. According to National Weather Service records, it was the first storm of its type to ever strike in the region.



Definition of Fujita Tornado Scale (F scale)

- (FO) Gale tornado (40-72 mph): Light damage Some damage to chimneys; break branches off trees; push over shallow-rooted trees; damage sign boards.
- (F1) Moderate tornado (73-112 mph): Moderate damage The lower limit (73 mph) is the beginning of hurricane wind speed; peel surface off roofs; mobile homes pushed off foundations or overturned; moving autos pushed off the roads.
- (F2) Significant tornado (113-157 mph): Considerable damage Roofs torn off frame houses; mobile homes demolished; boxcars pushed over; large trees snapped or uprooted; light-object missiles generated.
- (F3) Severe tornado (158-206 mph): Severe damage Roofs and some walls torn off well-constructed houses; trains overturned; most trees in forest uprooted; heavy cars lifted off ground and thrown.
- (F4) Devastating tornado (207-260 mph): Devastating damage Well-constructed houses leveled; structure with weak foundation blown off some distance; cars thrown and large missiles generated.
- (F5) Incredible tornado (261-318 mph): Incredible damage Strong frame houses lifted off foundations and carried considerable distance to disintegrate; automobile-sized missiles fly through the air in excess of 100 m; trees debarked; incredible phenomena will occur.
- (F6-F12) (319 mph to Mach 1, the speed of sound): The maximum wind speeds of tornadoes are not expected to reach the F6 wind speeds.







Its members include representatives of local, State, and Federal government as well as those of the private and nonprofit communities. The Association sponsors an annual conference on the state-of-the-art in flood hazard reduction. Conference topics always span a broad spectrum of issues of interest to those involved in floodplain management.

The Federal Interagency Floodplain Management Task Force has commissioned a study of the status and effectiveness of the Nation's floodplain management activity to fulfill recommendations set forth in the document "A Unified National Program for Floodplain Management." Special emphasis is to be placed on the floodplain management tools contained in this document. A status report is now being prepared. The Task Force has requested the assistance of the ASFPM in the second part of the study—an evaluation of the effectiveness of floodplain management measures—and the ASFPM has agreed to devote a portion of its 1988 conference to this effort.

The following specific topics are presented to enhance the discussion and evaluation of the effectiveness of floodplain management efforts during the Association's 1988 conference.

- · Efforts in analysis and management of special problem areas, e.g., alluvial fans, shifting streambeds, etc.
- Multiobjectives planning processes for the management of floodplains
- · Effectiveness of floodplain management tools, whether individually or in tandem
- · How the full range of benefits from nonstructural measures can be better identified and quantified
- How nonstructural measures can be made more attractive to local governments
- · Examples of wise or beneficial uses of the floodplain
- Solving specific floodplain management problems through a combination of selective tools and strategies
- How we can increase the public official and individual decisionmaker's awareness of flood hazard areas
 and the understanding of flood risk

About the Conference

The technical conference will run Tuesday through Thursday, including a field trip in the Nashville area. The conference will revolve around the idea of floodplain partners working in harmony as we evaluate the status of the Nation's floodplain management activity. 
